Ken Davis, has over 30 years of church-planting experience in South Carolina, Indiana, and Pennsylvania. He is currently on loan from BMM to direct Project Jerusalem, a ministry training church planter's through Baptist Bible Seminary in PA. Formerly he taught missions at Crossroads Bible College in Indianapolis, where he focused on reaching urban and ethnic Americans. A graduate of Bob Jones University (B.A., M.A.), he is now working on his D.Min. in missiology at Trinity Evangelical Divinity School.



Roger McNamara, a veteran church planter with Baptist Mid-Missions for more than 40 years, has started six congregations in both North and South America. He has written extensively in the field of planting and growing new churches and is co-author of *A Practical Guide to Church Planting* and *The Y-B-H Handbook of Church Planting*.



Roger is a graduate of Practical Bible Training School, Cedarville College, and holds a master's degree in the field of church growth and cross-cultural communications from Liberty University.

Dan Whitcher, has been involved in church planting most of his life, growing up in mission churches, and burdened for ministry as a teen. A graduate of Faith Baptist Bible College, he has served for 37 years in developing and establishing churches both in the United States and in Mexico. A part of BMM since 1982, Dan is the coordinator of the Mission's church planting efforts in North America.
