

## *The Double Edge of Love!*



“Teacher, which is the great commandment in the law?” Jesus said to him, “You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.’ This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like it: ‘You shall love your neighbor as yourself.’ On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets” (Matthew 22:36-40).

We recognize that Jesus is quoting two Old Testament commands (Deuteronomy 6:5 and Leviticus 19:18) and is ranking them as of first importance. These two commands are later incorporated into the New

Testament documents (ex. Romans 13:8-10, I John 4:20-21) and thus become binding on all of us. We must love God and we must love our neighbor!

Loving God supremely is a tall order. Engaging all of our heart, soul, and mind includes every facet of our being. Nor is this love simply emotional gush. The Apostle John insists that “this is the love of God, that we keep His commandments” (I John 5:3). Loving God with our entire being means that He is the supreme object of our affections, that He is the commander-in-chief over all our actions, and that He is the criterion to which we align all our thoughts. We arrange every facet of our life under, around, and for Him!

Yes, this is a tall order. Yet we can, we must obey it and live it out through the power of the Holy Spirit (Romans 5:5; Galatians 5:22). Because we have been created in the image of God we are equipped to love Him far more knowledgeably than any other of His creatures. And because we are new creatures in Christ and are empowered by His indwelling Spirit we can love Him far more consistently than even Old Testament believers could (Romans 8:3-4).

Loving God supremely is a private, personal thing – one on One – or so it seems. However, the second command to love intersects in such a way that if we fail at one, we also fail at the other. At this point, the double edge comes into play. John says that we cannot love God if we do not love our brother (I John 4:20-21). He also reverses this and says that the only way we can know that someone loves his brother is that He loves God and obeys His commands (I John 5:2). So we cannot pick and choose. We cannot have one without the other. Loving God supremely demands that we love our neighbors as ourselves – and vice versa.

Further, “our neighbor” is not just other believers. Paul put it this way, “Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all, especially to those who are of the household of faith” (Galatians 6:10). Our love is to embrace all kinds of folks, saved and unsaved, rich and poor, near and far, the powerful and the powerless—with God’s people being first in the pecking order!

Love God! Love people! Obedience to these two commands is a double-edged responsibility on all of God’s people today. ∞

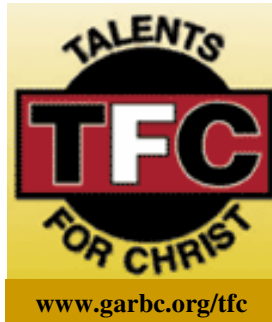


